DR. GEORGE MARTIN

Dr. Martin has been a pillar of the University of Washington Department of Pathology since joining the faculty in 1957. He is world-renowned for his research in cell senescence and in the identification of genetic mutations that underlie diseases of aging. His leadership in fostering aging research is well recognized, and includes service as president of the Gerontological Society of America, president of the American Federation of aging research, president of the tissue culture Association of America, director of cytogenetics UWMC and service on numerous NIH study sections, scientific boards of foundations, and editorships of major journals.

DR. DENNIS REICHENBACH

Dr. Reichenbach first joined the Department of Pathology at the University of Washington in 1959. During his many years of service, he has served at varying times as Pathologist-in-Chief, Harborview Medical Center (1982-1998), Director of the UWMC Electron Microscopy Laboratory, and Director of the Pathology Residency Training Program (1982-1988.) Despite his "retirement" in 1998, he continues as a Professor Emeritus with an active clinical service involving autopsy pathology and diagnostic cardiovascular pathology. Dr. Reichenbach, through his lengthy tenure at Harborview Medical Center and continued role on the UWMC autopsy service, has impacted every resident trainee in our program for over five decades.
